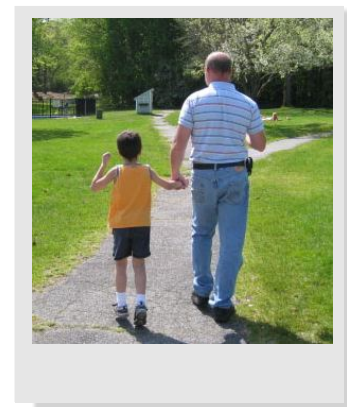
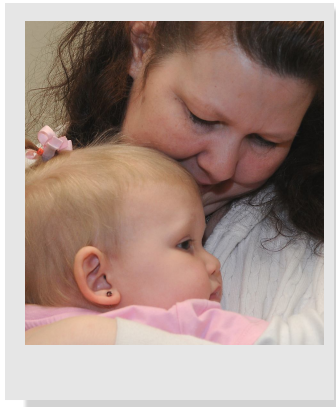

At The Moore Center, we built our reputation on programs and services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities and adults with Acquired Brain Disorders (ABD), and we're proud to provide these community members with professional supports that combine quality and compassionate care.

Beyond these constituents, though, we also serve children and families, we've established *Moore Options for Seniors*, which offers programs and services that make getting older far easier (and more fun), and we're a training resource for human services Direct Support and Management Professionals throughout the Granite State.

Empowering people, making room for their voices and their choices, is central to what we do. Whether we're giving those with developmental disabilities or brain injuries or their representatives the opportunity and responsibility to design meaningful supports and services or helping seniors manage their day-to-day lives with greater independence, we help people become more self-sufficient and engaged with the community.

How can we help you and your family?

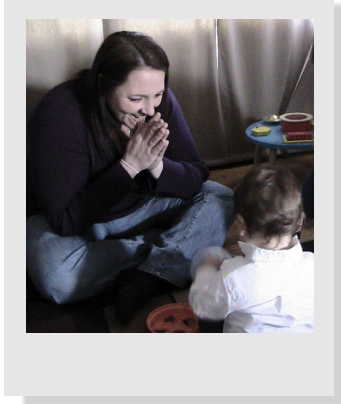
Age 0-3

Our Children's Services Department is at the heart of the comprehensive services we offer for children between birth and age three and their families. Providing family-directed, individualized supports, our offerings encompass Family-Centered Early Supports and Services - also known as Early Supports and Services (ESS), Autism Protocol Services and a number of other relevant services.

Serving families with babies and toddlers, ESS is designed to help children under age three to get a good start in life, especially when there are concerns about developmental delays. In New Hampshire, ESS is available to eligible children and their families in the time between the child's birth and his or her third birthday. These resources include a developmental evaluation, therapeutic interventions and instruction, guidance, referral to community resources, coordination of services, and transition assistance to available community supports and services upon the child's third birthday or when a child is no longer eligible for ESS.

No One's Alone

Kelly Fein and her family navigate the same challenges that others do, but with the added wild card of having two children with special needs—one with an autism spectrum disorder, another with a developmental delay. Fortunately, the Feins are not alone. The Moore Center lends support in the form of an Early Childhood Educator and an Occupational Therapist, and we're there as a resource to help them manage whatever comes up next.

Age 3-13

The Moore Center provides services to children between age three and 13 and their families. We provide age-appropriate, family-directed supports that assist families with services such as respite, consultation, information and referral and “In Home Supports,” a specific waiver service.

Age 14-21

Along with standard offerings like Family Support Services, we provide a number of services geared to people between the ages of 14 and 21. For instance, we help young adults to transition from the school system to adult services; we help those who are 18 or older to identify and apply for appropriate state and federal benefits; and we work with young adults who want to live in the community and need minimal supports to maintain their independence.

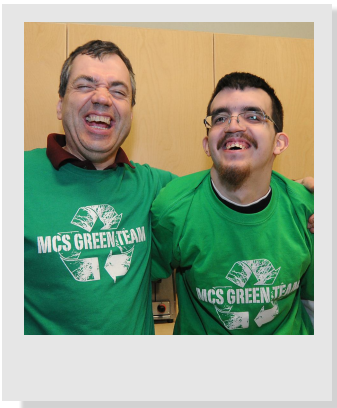

Age 21+

Our comprehensive community-based services for adults age 21 may include Individual Day Services, Employment Services and Residential Services, all designed to create a safe and caring atmosphere for people who require different levels of support. Individual day services encompass a number of individualized supports for living in the community and our Employment Services range from career development and mentoring to job training and placement with local businesses and organizations. We emphasize Participant Directed and Managed Services to allow the individual or their representative the greatest degree of choice and autonomy possible.

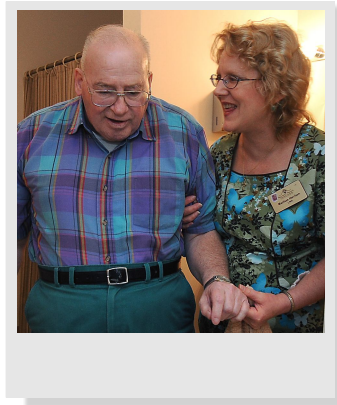
