FAMILY CENTERED EARLY SUPPORTS AND SERVICES

The Moore Center's Family Centered Early Supports and Services program provides services to infants, toddlers, and their families. These supports and services are individualized to each family's specific needs.

FCESS providers enhance parent-child relationships through play based activities. FCESS services are typically provided in a natural environment, most often in the family's home or child care setting.

This child receives services from an Early Intervention Specialist. She works with the family to teach them play-based strategies for language development. In the photo mom is playing with her son with direction from the provider when needed.



FAMILY DIRECTED SERVICES (ALSO CALLED PDMS)

Participant Directed and Managed Services is a program that helps individuals and families self-direct their own services. This department is made up of four individuals: Diane Martines, the Program Director; Katelyn Meagher, the Program Manager; Bobby Bist, Manager of Staffing; and Ryan Russo, the Administrative Assistant. The PDMS team and families work together to help meet the individual's needs and to insure they receive adequate and safe services. We also help families manage their budgets and follow 521 and 525 regulation requirements.

ADVOCACY SUPPORT GROUP (ASG)

Our Advocacy Support Group (ASG) aims to help educate and empower parents and guardians throughout their child's time in school and transitional services. The ASG provides support and resources to allow parents to advocate for their children's needs. The group brings in guest speakers, they share experiences, and collaborate.
