



Governor Sununu Veteos State Budget

On June 28th, Governor Sununu vetoed the 2-year budget that House and Senate Finance Committees presented to him. His main reasons for vetoing the budget are that it "sets up unsustainable spending expectations and 'job killing tax increases' that would put New Hampshire's booming economy at risk". This veto means the state will

operate under current spending levels for 90 days while the governor, House and Senate work to find a compromise for the new budget.
