The **New Hampshire Housing Relief Program** is designed to keep people from losing their housing and to secure or maintain permanent housing.

Governor Chris Sununu has authorized the allocation and expenditure of \$35 million from the CARES Act Coronavirus Relief Fund ("flex funds") to support families or individuals in need of housing assistance as a result of COVID-19. Of the allocated \$35 million, \$20 million will be initially expended, with \$15 million being held in reserve, for rent stabilization and housing support.

Ginsburg Remembered For Impact On Disability Rights



Best known for standing up for women's rights, U.S. Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg also played an outsized role in ensuring the rights of people with disabilities, advocates say.

Most notably, Ginsburg, who died Friday at the age of 87, wrote the majority opinion in the landmark 1999 ruling in Olmstead v. L.C. The decision affirmed the right of people with disabilities to live in the community.



Gov. Sununu creates Special Education Provider Fund



Governor Chris Sununu announced the creation of the Special Education Provider Fund, which will provide \$4 million for services for special needs students across New Hampshire.

"Private providers are an essential part of our special education system, and our public schools rely on them to meet their responsibilities to our most vulnerable students," said Sununu. "But because of their status as private companies, these special education providers had not be eligible for previous programs funded through the CARES Act. The Special Education Provider Fund will fill that gap, and ensure that New Hampshire students with disabilities are receiving the services they deserve."
