Just minutes from the bustling streets of downtown Manchester lies another world: the peaceful, calm and earthy silence of the Manchester Cedar Swamp—a place of ancient trees and giant ferns, a natural treasure in the midst of New Hampshire's largest city.

Unfortunately, for too many, the wonders of places like the Manchester Cedar Swamp have long been inaccessible. The reality is: not everyone can equally access our natural public spaces.

For some, standard trails do not offer a sufficiently level surface, gentle slope or secure footing. Others may feel unsafe or uncomfortable being in the woods or navigating traditional trails. Still more may be limited by transportation, unable to even reach these locations.
