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Continuous Medicaid Coverage Ending

A message from DHHS:

Information and resources for individuals who may be affected by the ending of federal continuous Medicaid coverage

Individuals have been receiving Medicaid coverage continuously during the COVID-19 federal public health emergency (PHE), even if they did not complete a redetermination of eligibility when it was due, or provide DHHS with requested information.

Last year, Congress passed legislation ending this continuous coverage, which ended on March 31, 2023. Individuals must complete their redeterminations or respond to Department requests for information about eligibility status to see if they are still eligible for Medicaid coverage.



What does this mean?

DHHS will continue to send redeterminations notices to individuals who are currently covered by Medicaid. To keep their coverage, individuals must either complete a redetermination or provide information requested by DHHS. These notices will be on yellow paper or posted to the individual's NH EASY account highlighted in yellow.

When individuals get a yellow notice, they should follow the instructions included in the notice and complete a redetermination and/or provide the requested verifications. This is necessary to determine if individuals are still eligible for, and will be able to keep their Medicaid coverage.
