

Announcing our New CCSNH Promise Program

An announcement from CCSNH:



New for the 2023-2024 academic year, the Community College System of New Hampshire (CCSNH) Promise Program will help eligible New Hampshire students with financial need to bridge the gap between grants and scholarships and the cost of tuition and required comprehensive fees at all of New Hampshire's community colleges. Funding is in place for the 2023-24 academic year, and thereafter will be subject to available funds.


Who is Eligible?

The Promise Program is need-based financial assistance for New Hampshire students enrolled in courses that are part of an academic degree or certificate program at one of seven community colleges. If you are eligible for a Pell grant of any amount, you may qualify.

You will know if you are Pell-eligible once you have submitted the federal Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), a form completed by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid.

Full and part-time students are eligible. To receive Promise Program funds, you must enroll for at least 6 credits per semester.
