HE-M 504 - Provider and Provider Agency Operations

A message from the Bureau of Developmental Services

He-M 504, regarding Provider and Provider Agency Operations, is now open for formal public comment. Information regarding the formal comment period duration, the public hearing, and where to submit comments may be found here:

He-M 504 defines the process of enrollment for providers of services to individuals with developmental disabilities and acquired brain disorders, as well as the roles and responsibilities of said providers. It's currently an emergency rule, effective June 28, 2023 and scheduled to expire on December 25, 2023. The Department of Health and Human Services is proposing to readopt with amendment He-M 504. **Click the link below to**

CtLC Steering Committee Shared Competencies Survey

The CtLC (Charting the LifeCourse) Community of Practice group, made up of the Bureau of Developmental Disabilities, Bureau of Elderly and Adult Services, Bureau of Family Centered Services, and the Bureau of Behavioral Health, is working to create shared competencies regarding person centered practices.

The first step is to gather information from individuals receiving services and their families about what are important skills for those who support them. Additionally, the same questions will be asked of professionals who support individuals and families.

The results of the survey will help create a set of expectations for those who work to support individuals and families. The set of skills and behaviors will be the same no matter what Bureau provides the services.

The goal is to help individuals, families and staff know what is expected to ensure that services are person centered.
