

Borrow the easy-to-use audio player and get books through the mail. Or listen anytime on your mobile device and many ereaders.

BARD is available for those who would like to download books. BARD is a collection of over 50,000 audiobooks and magazines and braille materials available for eligible readers to download.

The collection grows daily, and will soon include local and regional books produced by network libraries across the country.
