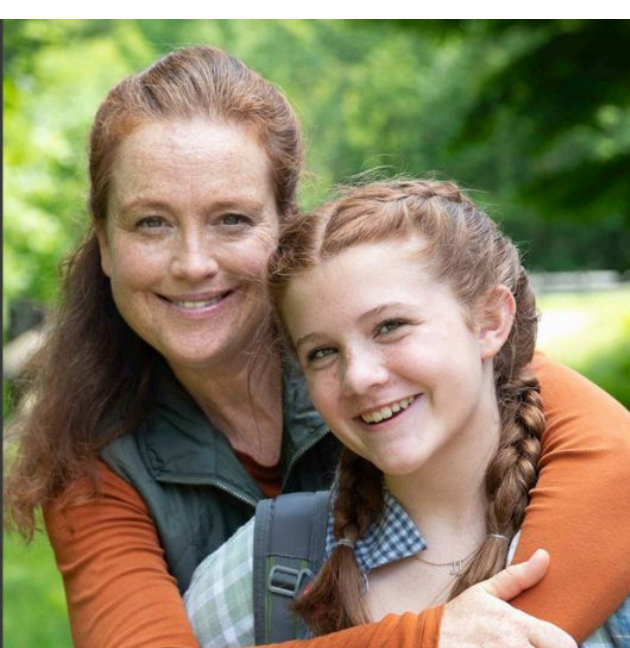

Funding Available for Moore Center Families:

Food Vouchers

The Moore Center's Family Support Council has purchased food vouchers to assist families with food purchases. If you would like to receive a food voucher for your family, please contact your case manager as soon as possible. **Food vouchers are limited in quantity and only available until the end of June.**

AND... We Have Funding Available for Qualified Purchases

Will you be purchasing or have you purchased a service or item within the past ten months that will help improve the quality of life for your disabled family member? The Moore Center may be able to reimburse you through financial assistance provided by the Family Support Council.

What is Available?

Up to \$500 to reimburse families for services and items purchased that are not covered by Medicaid. Up to \$2,000 to assist families with legal and educational advocacy and support and up to \$800.00 for qualified camperships.

Who is Eligible?

Moore Center Families (the person with a disability lives with the family or lives independently and receives support from the family)

When is the Deadline to Apply?

All requests must be submitted on or before June 20, 2025.

Financial assistance is subject to budget availability and approval by the Family Support Staff.
