Although government shutdowns typically disrupt many important services that are funded and administered by the federal government, the good news for now

Many of you have questions and concerns about the impact of the Government

is that community providers are unlikely to see any immediate disruption in the delivery of Medicaid-funded services. Likewise, there should be no delays in Medicaid payments from CMS assuming the shutdown does not extend beyond the end of this year. Nevertheless, we are not fully in the clear, and we may feel some indirect impacts, especially if the shutdown is prolonged". ANCOR is an on-line community of providers for people with disabilities and a good resource for national policy relative to disability-related issues.

ANCOR's encouraging words when she said, 'having seen the Governor's press release, they have looked closely at the impacts the shutdown will have on the current state systems and it appears to remain "business as usual" for the next 30-60-90 day timeframe. They are comfortable that we have been through this before on a few occasions and understand how to manage it.'


