Inaugural event is free and open to local residents

MANCHESTER, N.H. – January 28, 2026 – The Moore Center will host a free transition fair on Thursday, February 12, 2026, from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m. at their offices at 195 McGregor Street in Manchester, bringing together individuals with disabilities and their families, caregivers and service providers for an evening of connection, information and support.

The event is designed to help individuals of all ages and abilities — including those with developmental or intellectual disabilities and acquired brain disorders — explore services and resources available throughout Greater Manchester and across New Hampshire. Attendees will have the opportunity to engage directly with agencies that provide essential supports related to education, employment, healthcare, housing and community life.

“This event is about empowering people with information and helping families navigate what can often feel like a complex system,” said Michael W. Ames, PhD, president and chief executive officer at The Moore Center. “By bringing providers together in one place, we’re making it easier for individuals and families to find the supports that best meet their needs.”

The event is free and open to residents of Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Goffstown, Hooksett, Londonderry, Manchester and New Boston. Students interested in careers in human services are also encouraged to attend.
