The Moore Center to host home caregiver support and education event

Offered as part of agency's Kinship Program

MANCHESTER, N.H. – February 24, 2026 – The Moore Center will host an event for those providing care to family members at home on Friday, March 20, 2026, from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the Derryfield Country Club in Manchester. Through the agency's Kinship Program, the gathering is intended to provide information on important topics to help those managing home care for individuals who may have otherwise needed nursing home placement.

The Moore Center's Kinship Program allows families to be compensated for caring for a loved one at home. Individuals receiving care must qualify for Medicaid and the Choices for Independence program.

The Kinship event will feature expert speakers covering important topics such as understanding Alzheimer's and dementia, preventing caregiver burnout, and making the most of time with loved ones.

Attendees will also have opportunities to connect with others, learn early warning signs, gain self-care strategies, network with providers, and leave with valuable, practical information.


